



Further Developments in Visioning Research at SRI

- Learning self-hypnosis for speed reading
 - Based on <u>Silva Mind Control</u> methodology
- Synchronistic application of group self-hypnosis for non-local consciousness and remote viewing
 - A "remote viewing" of Apollo 13
- So why not do group remote viewing of the future?
- Guided cognitive imagery as a best practice/ appropriate technology for visioning
- "Omniverse Center" as an unexpected non-local consciousness experience

- Weekly "Visioning Skunk Works" as M.O. for intuition-based Futures R&D at SRI
- Illustrative examples
- Discovery of "Mental Time Travel" as a generic method for wise-choosing and impact assessment
- Advice that this sort of work needed to be kept well in the closet from politically sensitive clients
- The Age of Heretics by Art Kleiner (1996/2008)
 as a trustworthy documentation about the
 closeted side of our early futures work at SRI

At The Graduate Program in Studies of the Future, University of Houston-Clear Lake

- Transformation from Liberal Arts emphasis to training for work as a Professional Futurist
- Creating an operational laboratory for futures research and recruiting Peter Bishop to administer the program and our Institute for Futures Research
- Using a graduate course in Visionary Futures as my back channel "Skunk Works" for R&D on visionary futures research methods
- <u>Transformative ReVisioning</u> as a needed "selftherapy" after repeated "deep see diving" with Visionary Futures tools.




A New Typology of Wild-Card Archetypes

A Type II "Tipping Point" Toward Epochal Change





Where Intuition Is/Is Not "Indicated"

Intuition Leads to Better Decision Making

In situations involving novelty, uncertainty, and time pressure (immediacy of decision) where rational methods break down.

Intuition Leads to Worse Decision Making

In situations involving regularity, high data availability, etc. where rational methods do better.







Co-Creative partnerships at three levels of aggregation:


- Personal (egoic self ~ Higher Self)

Demonstration of Mental Time Travel and Transformative ReVisioning: "Type II" Mega-Crisis Futures



The springboard effect helps systems reorganize

- (1) People lose faith in the industrial system as crises worsen
- 2 Human and economic resources are released from the system
- ③ Support increases for both inclusive (sustainable) and exclusive (ethnocentric) solutions
- (4) If sustainable solutions are supported, constructive reorganization begins
- The reorganization of the global system accelerates or
- 6 If ethnocentric values and structures dominate, conflicts over scarce resources intensify
- Global civilization disintegrates

Five Archetypal Scenarios

- 1. "VUCA" world of rapidly increasing volatility, uncertainty, complexity and ambiguity—an "Expected" or Present Trends Extended (PTE) future
- 2. Civilizational Disintegration—a "Challenging" or worst case future
- 3. Reformative Civilizational Recovery—an "Aspirational" or "Visionary" future
- 4. Civilizational Enlightenment—an "Audaciously Visionary / Aspirational "or best case future
- 5. Singularity—an alternative "Audaciously Visionary / Aspirational" future.

The Five Archetypal Scenarios as "If-Then" Contingent Future Histories

These five scenarios are conceived as future histories, all of which are to some extent "Type II Wild Cards" (high probability as seen by those with relevant expert knowledge, but low credibility as seen by most others). Thus:

- If Scenario 1: VUCA, holds together until 2030, Scenario 5: The Singularity as envisioned by Ray Kurtzweil could emerge. Otherwise it is not likely to be feasible.
- If Scenario 1: VUCA, triggers a mega-crisis tipping point toward civilizational disruption, this could lead to the worst case of Scenario 2: Civilizational Disintegration; or the best case of Scenario 3: Reformative Civilizational Recovery and/or Scenario 4: Civilizational Enlightenment.
- Scenario 4: Civilizational Enlightenment could presumably unfold at any time, but is thought to be likely only after something like Scenario 3: Reformative Civilizational Recovery matures.

Mental Time Travel:

A practical tool for "remote experiencing"

- A generic method for intuition-based experiencing of different scenes in past and future history
- Where you can discover new patterns across time and/or feel
 the likely impacts of different scenarios and/or outcomes of
 choosing one strategy or path of action over another
- Can be used iteratively for impacts on self, team, company, customer, competitor, ecology

Exploring Alternative Future Scenarios With Mental Time Travel

- Obtain a facilitator who can guide you in the exploration
- Choose a scenario you would like to explore
- Relax and open your imaginal senses
- Follow facilitator's suggestions for exploration and reporting out

Outline of Generic Mental Time Travel Facilitation

- Do some method of entering the "state" e.g., relaxation w/10 steps downstairs
- Visualize a suitable setting in which to view and experience what you are looking for; include "inner advisor" if desired.
- Next, in your own way, invite your viewing capacity to begin the journey through time, getting initial sense impressions of what there is there for you to see.
- Whenever appropriate, pause the journey in order to more deeply experience all the types of senses that are appropriate for a more full understanding.
- Before returning, be sure to review and feel all that happened, perhaps getting a symbol that summarizes it all, as though you were getting ready to give a post journey briefing, in order to transfer the experience to your long-term memory.

Transformative ReVisioning: A Self-Therapy for Futures Burn-Out

- A generic process tool for transforming one's image of any type of stressful situation (person, event, forecast, belief) from being a resisted irritant to being a challenging opportunity
- Where you first get and then explore a meaningful image to symbolize the situation as you now see it
- After which you use your "higher" wisdom sources within to transform this image into a new image that symbolizes opportunity rather than threat.






Figure Five "Highest Self" as common to all individual selves




Figure Six Physical, Subtle and Causal Aspects of the Self



Appendix: My Current Professional Aspirations

- Further development of "Field Aligned" Aspirational Visioning, emphasizing "heart" more than "head," "Being" more than "doing"
- Sewing seeds for Visioning Skunk Works initiatives using Aspirational Visioning and related process tools
- Funded snowball survey of "proven edgewalkers" for crowd-sourced identification of positive Type II Wild-Cards, followed by Open Space Technology-based meetings for entrepreneurial creativity and innovation
- Visiting Fellow at selected institutions

Evolving Progression in Relaxation-Based Access to "Field Aligned" Intuition

- Hypnosis-based dissociation (e.g., traditional age regression & past life recall methods)
- Non-hypnotic suggestive "mind control" (e.g., Silva method)
- Non-hypnotic suggestive "enabling facilitation" (e.g., Rossman method)
- Crowd sourcing of "field aligned" aspirational visioning: personal, interpersonal and transpersonal (methods under development, but to include Theory U)
